Our focus is not only on financial support but on enabling girls to be confident professionals with solid values, which has resulted in all the girls who have completed their education (20), secured jobs, or running their small enterprises.

The academic successes of our Aatmajas delight us just like our family's. Happy to share that all girls have performed very well in their academics this year too. We plan to grow to support over 275 Aatmajas this year. We are now supporting girls from rural Maharashtra by partnering with NGO "Vidyarthi Sahayak Samiti," which provides well-managed hostels for needy girls with good academics. Rather than scaling faster, we focus on quality support for our girls. Over the years, we hope to create a significant impact by supporting 500-plus girls and making their families financially independent.

I am forever grateful to our donors and CSR partners, trustees and volunteers, and dedicated staff, without whom we wouldn't have been able to support our Aatmajas in these last seven years.

Last year has been a year of recovery for Aatmaja. We know that the impact of COVID will be felt for years to come. We have seen several of our Aatmajas struggle to learn and cope up in the world online classes and now back to in person classes. We debated the merits and debates of the process that we are currently following, we realized the importance of having a shorter time frame to help our Aatmajas become financially independent. And our new program Aasha was born. Our basic criteria of selection from economically challenged background remained the same, we tweaked the academic qualifications a bit. Today we have around 10 Aatmajas pursuing, nursing, diploma, and sports as a career choice to achieve within three years. I am looking forward to learning and changing Aasha as a program as we see more success.



### Neeraj Joshi

As I look back at the year, I see so many learning opportunities for our Aatmajas. I am passionate about teaching teenagers the risks of the internet world and was fortunate enough to coach our Aatmajas about Cyber Security. Our Aatmajas are inquisitive and eager to learn. I would want them to be exposed to newer technologies, better ways to learn and help them carve out a career that makes them financially independent and allows them to learn. Our Asha program has been tremendous success last year. Results of our 10<sup>th</sup> grade, 12<sup>th</sup> grade, Engineering, BCom and all other disciplines tell us that we are on right track. I would like to see more collaboration happening between our CSR partners, Donors and Aatmajas going forward that would create more learning opportunities.



## PROGRAMS UDAAN AND AASHA

Under the Udaan and Aasha programs, we continue to support 280 Aatmajas.

### **PROGRAM - UDAAN**

We provide merit- and need-based mentorship to girl students from disadvantaged backgrounds studying in 10th standard onwards. Deserving girls are selected through well-defined selection criteria and will be supported for 7-8 years, until they become independent professionals. Every year we plan to add 30 to 40 deserving girls to this programme.

**Financial Support** – We reimburse students school fees, fees of recommended additional coaching, books & notebooks / Travel expenses

**Skill Development & Training** – Various training programs are conducted for students like Leadership development, Effective communication, Spoken english, Time management for overall development.

**Career Counselling Guidance and Mentoring** –We organize aptitude tests and counselling by experts for choosing the right professional career and mentor the girls as they prepare for the same

Health Awareness - We arrange sessions for health awareness - personal hygiene, nutrition and safety

**Strong Foundation of Values** – We believe – 'Do what is right and not what is easy.' So we want to create a strong foundation of values for our Aatmajas

**Vibrant Network of Aatmajas** – We enable students to create a strong support system to each other through a vibrant network of Aatmajas



The meagre monthly income brought home by her father, who used to be a helper in a pre-school, and her homemaker mother, who has several health issues, clearly reflects their economic situation. But her parents support and motivate her to achieve her goal under challenging circumstances. She wants to become a Doctor to serve poor people.

As per Tanvi: I required a support system to sustain my education and achieve my goals. I received precisely this kind of support from the Aatmaja Foundation.

I scored 509/720 in NEET which is an amazing score considering the competition in the exam. Today, I am a 1st year of BAMS at Tilak Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya and is on my way to reaching my dream. With hope in her eyes, she says - "I want to become a good doctor. I'm sure I will and with Aatmaja Foundation supporting my education.



We plan to achieve gold rating on GuideStar and increase our reach further to rural Maharashtra. We want to expand our donor base and partner with new companies to be part of their CSR programs. We want to make our alumni network stronger to be able to help our girls to get right mentors and help.

This year we also want to donor and beneficiary surveys to get feedback and also strengthen our performance metrics measurement program.
